Youth Survey Key Findings 2008

- (1) Most youth in Wyoming are making good decisions about alcohol:
- (2) Many youth drastically over-estimate the prevalence of drinking among their peers and are therefore at greater risk for using alcohol themselves;
- (3) Many youth are using alcohol which is both illegal and risky.

All of these conclusions must be addressed in a comprehensive prevention effort.

So, while most high school students in Wyoming are making good decisions about alcohol, the negative impacts for some that do are devastating. Alcohol-related accidents among 15-24 year-olds are the leading cause of death. Alcohol use contributes to poor academic performance, violence, property damage, sexual assaults, and other negative consequences.
